





4818. מֶּרְכָּבְה merkavah

- A feminine noun meaning chariot. It refers to something ridden, for riding and is used of a two-wheeled vehicle, drawn by horses and normally used in war. Its uses include a war chariot (Ex 14:25; 15:4); a chariot used by the state in its processions or for travel in general (Gen 41:43; 46:29; Isa 22:18). It was a symbol of military might and war (Isa 2:7). It is used figuratively of the vehicles of war used by the Lord (Isa 66:15; Hab 3:8). Israel constructed some idolatrous "chariots of the sun" (2 Kings 23:11).
